From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Members of St. Mary of the Hill Parish,

Praise be Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary His Mother! Our dream of a new church is becoming a reality.

Our new church will hold 300 people (vs. our current space holding 200 people). We will have a raised sanctuary and an adoration chapel that we hope will someday host perpetual adoration of our Blessed Lord here on the Holy Hill site. What a tremendous opportunity God has given us to make a difference for our parish now and into the future!

We need your help to get this project off the ground. We are trying to raise \$1.6 million dollars by this coming October 2023, which is one half of the estimated \$3.2 million project cost (We have already raised about \$900,000.00).

To raise these funds, people in our parish are working diligently on organizing fund raisers, and soliciting special donations within and outside of the parish. It is truly "ALL HANDS-ON DECK!"

But even with all of this extraordinary effort, we are going to need to conduct a general parish wide pledge drive, giving everyone an opportunity to contribute to this historic effort. We will be conducting this pledge drive this summer. Letters will go out to all parishioners later in June. Please pray and discuss this with your family. We are hoping everyone will stretch and be as generous as you can. It is the only way we can reach this ambitious goal. Most importantly though, as we have said from the beginning of this project, we want you to give from your heart!

Finally, please pray for the success of this effort. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity! We need everyone to be involved! Thank you all in advance for your prayerful generosity!

Additionally, please join me in welcoming Brother Jonathan Maria, one of our Carmelite students, who will be

assisting at the parish over the summer. Brother Jonathan is in 2nd year philosophy at St John's Seminary in the Archdiocese of Boston, and currently lives in Brighton.

My name is Br. Jonathan Maria of the Cross. I came to the U.S., from Denmark, in 2019 to enter the Order of Discalced Carmelites of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. I was confirmed into the Church in June of 2014 after a period of much sorrow and despair in my life. It was an encounter with

God that brought me out of the darkness of the atheism I had championed and into the light of the Truth. Encountering God became the moment that defined my life.

For five years I discerned the vocation to diocesan priesthood with the Diocese of Copenhagen. I grew to love the priesthood more, but I also realized that the life of a diocesan priest does not offer the same opportunity for a life of prayer, as I had come to desire. During this period of discernment two major influences came into my life – St. John of the Cross and the Carmelite community of nuns in St. Josef's Carmel in Hillerød, Denmark. The teaching of St. John of the Cross came into my life at a crucial time when prayer had lost its sweetness and I was in desperate need of a guide. Through the writings and example of St. John of the Cross and the support and prayers of my Carmelite sisters, I came to realize that I should discern the vocation of a Discalced Carmelite Friar. Sadly, Denmark is not exactly a hub of religious orders, the Catholic Church being a very small minority (0.01% of the population) and so I had to seek a community of religious friars somewhere else. Eventually, through the work of the nuns, I came to learn of Holy Hill and I decided to reach out. After the first visit to Holy Hill I knew God had brought me to something special and I decided that I would enter.

While all vocations entail sacrifices, I've come to experience that the sacrifices we make for God in pursuit of doing His will are filled with delight and that on the Cross, we also find Christ.

According to Colleen DiNicola at Mintz.com, "The U.S. DOS has been dealing with significant backlogs since 2020, when passport offices nationwide were closed, followed by limited phased re-openings starting in late 2020. This caused a backlog of millions of applications." As

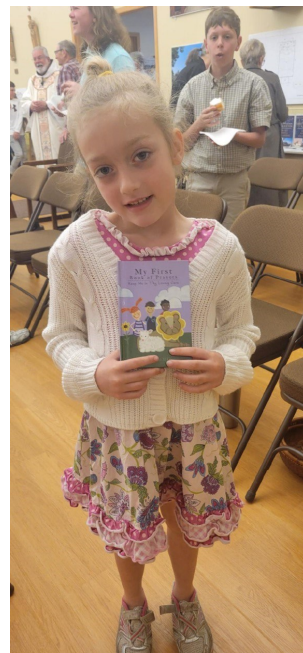

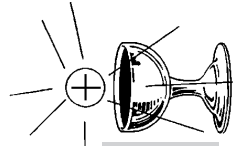
