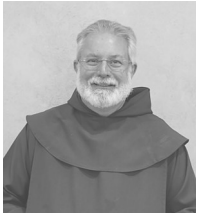

## From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Members of St. Mary of the Hill Parish Family,  
Praised be Jesus Christ!

On August 11 some members of our Building Team and I attended a meeting with officials of the Archdiocese. I am very pleased to tell you that the meeting went very well and that we are progressing nicely with our building plans. In fact we were told to no longer call it a “designated worship space” but what it truly is...a church!

If you didn't hear my announcement the weekend of August 5 and 6 I would like to share it with you again because it's really good news. While Tony Heppe will provide an update on the results of our Flea Market held on July 29th, I want to share with you that it was our highest grossing Antique/Flea Market in the history of the Parish! We would not be able to run this event without the hard work of so many of you. I humbly say thank you from the bottom of my heart for all the volunteer efforts that made this event a success. We are a truly blessed parish community with so many willing hands to help. Thank you!

The good news doesn't end there. The pledge drive for our new church, kicked off a few short weeks ago, has raised approximately \$350,000 in pledges through the generosity of our parish! That is a fantastic number and I thank those of you who have already returned your pledge cards.

We are closing in on the needed funds to complete building a new worship space. To date, we have \$2.2 million in cash and pledges. That is an outstanding start to our building fund raising. You may have noticed the progress thermometer as you entered the parish. This will be updated periodically with our progress. If we can get the rest of the parish to pledge or donate at the pace people did during the first five weeks of our pledge drive, our new church will become a reality! So Thank you!

There is a lot of activity taking place currently to help raise additional funds – let me name a few:

- **The net proceeds from this years (and probably the next 2 years) Antique/Flea Market will go to the building fund.**
- **Our 99th Anniversary Dinner Auction on August 13 was practically sold out. In addition, through the generosity of members of our parish, members of the larger community, and local businesses, we had some outstanding items up for auction. We look forward to our 100th Anniversary Dinner Auction as well next year!**
- **Also, we are working through a rebidding process with two builders to fine tune the building estimates we received over a year ago. Much has changed in the industry over this past year and we are hoping that our estimates may come down through this process.**
- **Finally, there is work underway to secure what we call “donations-in-kind”. These are donations from parish members or businesses that will reduce the cost of our project. For example, we have a tree removal service offering to clear the building site free of charge. This will save us \$20,000 that was in the bid.**

I feel so blessed to be a part of a parish community that is so generous with their time, talent, and treasure. But we still have a distance to go to meet our goal. Only about 40% of our pledge cards have been returned. I urge you to please return your pledge card as soon as possible. Our approval meeting with the Archdiocese is in a few short weeks and we need a strong showing in our pledges to put us in a solid position for that meeting. May God reward you! If for whatever reason you cannot donate to our building project, I humbly ask that you PRAY for the success of this worthy endeavor. More things are accomplished by prayer than this world realizes. Thank you again from the bottom of my heart and may Our Lady of Good Success continue to intercede for us!

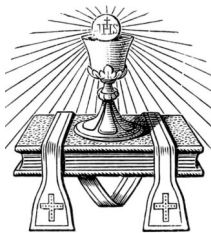

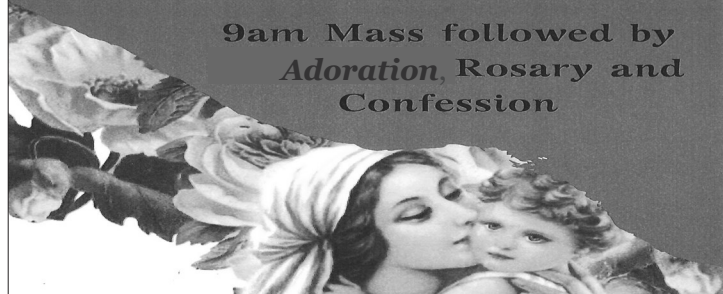

## In the Community...

### From Human Concerns

October is the month we celebrate Respect Life. Last year our focus was on life from conception to natural death. With the legal changes of last year, it has become evident that we need to win back the hearts and minds of our world for God's plan to be recognized and reinstituted.

Part of winning back hearts and minds for God is regaining control of words we use. For example, a fetus is no longer considered a stage of a developing person. Somehow we need to return "fetus" to part of normal development, in line with a newborn, a toddler, a teenager and an octogenarian. The thought of viability defining humanness needs to be challenged. A fetus is a human person, and it is exactly where it needs to be to be viable. I am not viable if removed from my environment either. Perhaps we need to say "we're having a baby, it's currently a fetus."

Changes in our vocabulary can also help those around us gain a greater respect for life. When an individual has minimal detectable brain activity, let's not say "he's a vegetable" but rather "he is in an altered state of consciousness." "Choice" is not to decide what is convenient for me, but rather deciding to end life or let it continue.

During Covid much was said about you have to follow the science. So let's follow the science. A recent poll of Embryologists and Geneticists found 87% hold that a unique human being is present as soon as the egg and sperm formed a single cell. The rest of these experts spoke of viability. Human Development follows a progression that is well documented.

Let us join in prayer that our God, who can do all things, opens the hearts and minds of all people to the reality of what life is. Let us do our part as well with His guidance.
