Dear Parishioners,

You should be receiving this sometime before Holy Week but I'm writing on Mardi Gras (Fat Tuesday), the day before Ash Wednesday. It was so good to see so many of you at our celebration at the Hartford Town Hall!

Did you know that Pope Francis declared 2024 as a "Year of Prayer?" Pope Francis announced the start of a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Catholic Church's 2025 Jubilee Year.

In his Angelus address, the pope said that a Year of Prayer - which started on Jan. 21 - will be "a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world." "Dear brothers and sisters, the coming months will lead us to the opening of the Holy Door, with which we will begin the jubilee," Pope Francis said from the window of the Apostolic Palace. "I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare us to live this event of grace well and to experience the power of God's hope. That is why today we begin a Year of Prayer."

The pope said that the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization will publish resources to help Catholic communities to more fully participate in the Year of Prayer. The Holy See Press Office has also announced that a press conference on the Year of Prayer will take place on Jan. 23. The Vatican and the city of Rome are expecting an estimated 35 million people to flock to the Eternal City for the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope — the first ordinary jubilee since the Great Jubilee of 2000.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often, such as in the case of the 2016 Year of Mercy or the 2013 Year of Faith. The 2025 Jubilee Year begins on Dec. 24, 2024 (Christmas Eve), and concludes on Jan. 6, 2026. So, it looks like our new church will be opening during the Jubilee Year, what a great blessing for us and our parish! 2025 also marks the 100th Anniversary of the canonization of St.

Speaking of our new church I would like to share this update concerning our project from Dick Clement our Building Committee Chair...

"We continue to work on designing our new church with things changing almost daily. Late last year we hired Groth Design Group as our architect to help us design our new church. This is a different architect that we have worked with to date. Groth has been designing worship spaces for 30 years and has designed over 70 Catholic churches. Their work and their team are quite impressive and we are excited to be working with them. Since last November, our Design committee has been meeting with the architect to conceptualize what our new church will look like. This is an iterative process with the architect first learning how we worship, then soliciting ideas from the Design and Building Committees. The architect then proposes ideas for the church which are reviewed by the committees and feedback is given. We should have new renderings to show the parish in early March. The new concepts utilize our view of Holy Hill and incorporate your feedback wherever possible. I am very excited with the direction we are going with the new church and continue to be thankful for your generosity and the countless volunteer hours that go into making this project possible. Thank you!"

Finally I want to share a brief essay I received from one of our First Communion candidates, 8 year old Luke Davies, entitled **Go to Church...**

"Have you talked to God lately? If not you should go to church. My opinion is everyone should go to church once a week. It's your special time with God. You can pray. It is a time to ask for help and forgiveness. Another reason is to get closer to God. You can receive the Eucharist which is Jesus! Body and blood. The last reason is to praise God by singing and living the Gospel. By going to Mass you will know, love, and serve God. When it is all over you get donuts and milk while visiting with friends. These are my reasons for going to church every Sunday." -Luke

Thank you Luke for your insightful essay. It makes a good reflection for Lent!

Our Easter Vigil will be held March 30th at 8:00PM in the Basilica. We are privileged to have several Baptisms and Confirmations this year. Welcome to St. Mary of the Hill Parish!





Human Concerns

In the mid 1960's California's branch of Planned Parenthood outlined its future goals. The main goal was to legalize abortion, however it believed that achieving this would the struggle of a few decades. Yet in 1973 abortion was legalized. The culture of death rejoiced.

Along with abortion, euthanasia became seen as a right for people to choose. It allowed terminally ill people to end their lives "on their terms." This has been expanded in Canada now allowing ending the lives of the mentally ill as well This is after Canadian Parliament ruled that death does not need to be "reasonably foreseeable" to qualify for assisted suicide.

Based on the Canadian law, nearly anyone with disabilities or a chronic medical condition qualifies for euthanasia. Now the homeless, poor, and disabled are seeking assisted suicide. Currently one quarter of Canadian citizens believe that the poor and homeless be allowed this choice.

An odd group of allies are against this proposal. The United Nations, NPR and the Catholic Right to Life groups are together on condemning this. How long will this alliance stand before this idea takes root throughout the world? In Canada ending the lives of the mentally ill is on hold because there aren't enough doctors willing to participate, just like in the early days of abortion. Padre Pio, facing evil, would proclaim: "Bring me my weapon," and pull out his rosary. Perhaps we can pull out our weapon this Lent 3 and confront evil.
